AMENDMENT TO THE ANDHRA PRADESH NURSE TRAINING INSTITUTIONS (ADMISSION INTO GENERAL NURSE TRAINING AND GRANT OF PERMISSION TO PRIVATE SCHOOLS OF NURSING) RULES, 1997.

In Exercise of powers conferred by Section 99 of the Andhra Pradesh Education Act, 1982 (Act I of 1982), the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby issue the following amendments to the Andhra Pradesh General Nurse Training Institutions (Admissions into General Nurse Training and Grant of permission to Private Schools of nursing) Rules, 1997 issued in G.O.Ms.No. 313, Health, Medical and Family Welfare (M2) Department, dated 16th August, 1997 and as amended from time to time.

AMENDMENTS

In the said rules:-

- (1) For rule 2, the following shall be substituted, namely;
- “2. CATEGORISATION OF SEATS:
- (i) fifty percent (50%) of the total number of seats shall be set apart as “Government quota seats” and the remaining fifty percent of seats (50%) shall be called “Management quota seats”.
- (2) For sub-rule (1) of rule-3, the following shall be substituted, namely;

“3. METHOD OF ADMISSION :-

1. Admission to “Government Quota seats” shall be made by a Selection Committee consisting of the following for each district:-
- (i) District Medical and Health Officer, Chairman-cum-Convener
- (ii) Superintendent of Government District Hospital. .. Member
- (iii) Deputy Director, Social Welfare Department .. Member
- (iv) Principal of Nursing School concerned .. Member
- (3) For the words, “Free seats” wherever occurred in rules shall be substituted with the words, “Government quota seats.”
- (4) After the existing para in sub rule (4) of rule 3, the following shall be added namely:-

“The minimum seats for each Nursing School should be 45, subject to maximum of 60 seats as per Indian Nursing Council regulations.”

“Provided, Government can enhance seats to the Institutions where the seats are less than 60, based on inspection report conducted or caused to be conducted by the Director of Medical Education, A.P., Hyderabad. The managements should submit a prescribed application seeking enhancement of seats together with demand draft for Rs.3,000/- (Rupees three thousand only) drawn in favour of the Director of Medical Education, A.P., Hyderabad and submit to the Director of Medical Education. The Director of Medical Education shall appoint and send inspection team to such Nursing School for inspection and after receipt of inspection report, the same shall be submitted to

Government with necessary recommendations of the Director of Medical Education. On receipt of report, Government will take necessary action for issue of orders on enhancement of seats.”

(5) For rule 5, the following shall be substituted, namely:-

“5. FEE STRUCTURE:-

- (i) An amount of Rs.1000/- (Rupees one thousand only) per month per candidate can be charged for “Government Quota Seats”. As regards Management quota seats, the fee shall not be more than Rs.5,000/- (Rupees five thousand only) per month per candidate.
 - (ii) It shall be competent for the Government to fix the maximum fee chargeable for Government Quota seats and also fix an upper limit in respect of fee for the Management quota seats.
 - (iii) The other fees shall be fixed for each candidate for both Government quota and Management Quota seats as follows:-
 1. Admission fee-----Rs.500/- per annum.
 2. Caution money deposit (refundable) Rs.1,500/-
 3. Special fees (Extra curricular, sports, games, function etc.)-----Rs.1,500/- per annum
 4. Uniform fee-----Rs.2,500/- per annum
 5. Transportation-----Rs.300/- per month
 6. Library fee-----Rs.500/- per annum
 7. Laboratory fee-----Rs.2,500/- per annum
 8. Referred fee (for failed students)-----Rs.250/- per subject.
 - (iv) It shall be competent to Government to revise the fees from time to time.
- (6) For sub-rule (2) of rule 6, the following shall be substituted, namely:-
- (2). EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS AND AGE. According to the Indian Nursing Council Regulations, 1986.
 - (i) For admission to Diploma in G.N.M. Course, the first, July be specified as the notional date for counting the age in the relevant academic year admission. The minimum age shall be 16 years completed and enter 17th year as on the 1st July of the year in which the admission is sought. The maximum age shall be 35 years. For S.C., S.T., and B.C. students, relaxation of upper age can be made for three years.”

- (ii) The following calendar is fixed for making admissions and examinations:-
1. Completion of all admissions by end of July.
 2. Classes to commence by 1st of August.
 3. Annual examinations by middle of June/July.
 4. Supplementary examinations by December.
- (iii) The Andhra Pradesh Nurses and Midwaives Council, should prescribe and standardise a common application form for examinations.

3. EXAMINATION CENTRES :

- (i) There shall be one examination centres in each district for both Government and Private Schools and they will take their written examination at these centres. Practicals etc. shall be done at the district hospital/teaching hospital. The examinations may preferably be conducted at Government Degree Colleges, Government Junior Colleges or other Government Institutions in the District. For Hyderabad, Visakhapatnam or Vijayawada depending upon number of students more than one center can be opened. The Director of Medical Education should notify examination centers keeping in view the location of schools and students. Examinations shall be conducted by Director of Medical Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad. At the district level, examinations will be supervised by the Medical Superintendent of the Government. District Hospital.
- (7) For rule 12, the following shall be substituted, namely:-
- (i) The Director of Medical Education in the capacity of Ex-Officio President of Andhra Pradesh. Nursing Council will prepare an appropriate proforma for application form for Essentiality Certificate and the price of the application form shall be Rs.5,000/- and is revisable by the Government from time to time.
 - (ii) The President, Andhra Pradesh Nurses and Midwaives Council, or Inspection team appointed by him shall conduct two inspections of the proposed Nursing School, while giving its recognition within a gap of three months, so that after first inspection is over, the Management of the school is able to have sufficient time to rectify what ever the deficiencies are pointed out and communicated to them. If the school is having all the facilities and maintaining in conformity with the regulations of Indian Nursing Council, New Delhi, based on inspection report, further action can be taken for its recognition and

there is no need to send second inspection before recognition. The inspection fee for each inspection shall be Rs.2,500/- (Rupees two thousand and five hundred only) and shall be payable to the Director of Medical Education, A.P., Hyderabad by way of Demand Draft drawn in favour of the President Andhra Pradesh Nurses and Midwaives Council.

- (iii) After recognition, there shall be conducted two inspections for each year to verify whether the institute is following Indian Nursing Council regulations and norms prescribed by Government/Director of Medical Education, A.P., Hyderabad.

AMENDMENT TO THE ANDHRA PRADESH PRIVATE PARA
MEDICAL TRAINING INSTITUTIONS (GRANT OF
PERMISSION AND REGULATION OF ADMISSION INTO
PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS) RULES, 1997.

In Exercise of powers conferred by Section 99 of the Andhra Pradesh Education Act, 1982 (Act 1 of 1982), the Governor of Andhra Pradesh, hereby makes the following amendment to the Andhra Pradesh Private Para Medical Training Institutions (Grant of Permission and Regulation of Admission into Private Institutions) Rules, 1997 issued in G.O.Ms.No. 304, Health Medical and Family Welfare (K2) Department, dated 7th August, 1997 and as amended from time to time:-

AMENDMENT

In the said rules:-

- 1) After sub rule (3) of rule 3, the following shall be added namely:-

“2. Provided, Government can enhance seats to the Institutions where the seats are less than 60, based on inspection report conducted or caused to be conducted by the Director of Medical Education, A.P., Hyderabad. The managements should submit a prescribed application seeking enhancement of seats together with demand draft for Rs.3,000/- (Rupees three thousand only) drawn in favour of the Director of Medical Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad and submit to the Director of

Medical Education. The Director of Medical Education shall appoint and send inspection team to the Institutions for inspection and after receipt of inspection report, the same shall be submitted to Government with necessary recommendations of the Director of Medical Education. On receipt of report, Government will take necessary action for issue of orders on enhancement of seats.”

(2) For rule 5, the following shall be substituted, namely:-

“5. FEE STRUCTURE:-

- (i) An amount of Rs.1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) per month per candidate can be charged for “Government Quota Seats”. As regards Management quota seats, the fee shall not be more than Rs.3,000/- (Rupees three thousand only) per month per candidate.
 - (ii) It shall be competent for the Government to fix the maximum fee chargeable for Government Quota seats and also fix an upper limit in respect of fee for the Management quota seats.
 - (iii) The other fees shall be fixed for each candidate for both Government quota and Management Quota seats as follows:-
 1. Admission fee-----Rs.500 per annum.
 2. Caution money deposit (refundable) Rs.1,500/-
 3. Special fees (Extra curricular, sports, games, function etc.)-----Rs.1,500/- per annum
 4. Library fee:-----Rs.500/- per annum
 5. Laboratory fee-----Rs.2,500/- per annum
 6. Referred fee (for failed students)-----Rs.250/- per subject.
 - (iv) It shall be competent to Government to revise the fees from time to time.”
- (3) After sub rule (2) of rule 6, the following shall be added, namely:-
- “3. The following calendar is fixed for making admissions and examinations:-
1. Completion of all admissions by end of July,
 2. Classes to commence by 1st of August
 3. Annual examinations by middle of June/July.
 4. Supplementary examinations by December.

4. The Director of Medical Education should prescribe and standardise a common application form for examinations.
 5. The Director of Medical Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad shall conduct the examinations.
 6. The candidates who pass the two years Diploma course are eligible for admission into the corresponding degree course come under the control of N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Andhra Pradesh, Vijayawada.”
- (4) For Sub rule (1) of rule 9, following shall be substituted, namely:-

“The Institutions which require clinical attachment to Government Hospitals for purposes of training of their students, shall pay a fee of Rs.1,000- (Rupees one thousand only) per student per annum. If the clinical training required is less than one year and up to six months, as per the curriculum or for the specialisation, which are not available in private hospitals, the Government Hospital concerned should charge an amount of Rs.500/- (Rupees five hundred only) per student for clinical training.”
